



You will be driven the short distance to the exclusive Field of Light location. With just enough time for some background commentary on the internationally renowned artist Bruce Munro, you will arrive to see his artistic endeavour. In complete darkness this once-in-a-lifetime experience will be etched in your mind forever. Walk through the field of 50,000 spheres of light at your own pace and then make your way to the top of a large sand dune to the Field of Light sunrise viewing area. The site is dark, so to ensure you make the most out of your Uluru experience, we recommend you use your phone light or bring a small torch to help navigate your way on the pathway provided. At the viewing area you will be served tea, coffee or hot chocolate as the sun starts to rise and lights up the surrounding desert. From here you can see both Uluru and Kata Tjuta as the desert comes to life.

Uluru Guided Base Walk

Uluru Morning Guided Base Walk




Join your Guide on a 10.5 kms walk around the entire base of Uluru. Along the way, enjoy a light breakfast as you begin to absorb the enormity and beauty of your surroundings. Beginning at Kuniya Piti, a sacred site, hear the Tjukurpa story (beliefs and law of Anangu, the local Aboriginal people) of the Mala Men. Continue around Uluru to the Mala Walk, one of the most important habitation areas for the local Aboriginal people over thousands of years. It includes a visit into Kantju Gorge, where after rainfall, water can cascade over the side of Uluru and plunge some 90 metres. After a short break continue to the Lungkata Walk where your Guide will tell you the Tjukurpa story of the cheeky Blue Tongue Lizard! Next stop is the Mutitjulu Waterhole, once an important water source for the Anangu. Your Guide will indicate the natural features of the landscape, as well as Aboriginal rock art, and relay more traditional stories relating to this special place. Finally return to Kuniya Piti and board your coach for the short drive to Ayers Rock Resort.

Uluru Culture & Kata Tjuta Trails



Visit Kata Tjuta, 36 rock domes rising from the desert floor. From here, set out on the Walpa Gorge Walk, following a rugged path that winds between towering red cliffs. Take in the unique flora and fauna that thrive in this remote environment. Next, visit the Uluru-Kata Tjuta Cultural Centre, to gain a deeper understanding of Anangu culture including Tjukurpa, traditional law and the spiritual connection between the land and its traditional owners. See informative exhibits and locally made art and learn about the ongoing efforts to preserve and respect this World Heritage-listed area. Return to the Resort for lunch (own expense). Finally, your journey takes you partially around the base of Uluru, starting with the Kuniya Walk. Stop to view rock art, the Mutitjulu Waterhole, and other culturally significant sites, making for a truly unforgettable cultural experience.







Alice Springs Highlights & Nature Escape




Begin with a visit to Reverend John Flynn's grave, the visionary founder of the Royal Flying Doctor Service. Then marvel at the dramatic beauty of Simpsons Gap. Join your Driver Guide for a walk through this natural corridor, carved over millions of years. Explore the cultural and geological wonder of Angkerle (Standley Chasm), a site of deep significance to the local Arrernte people. On a one-hour guided hike, see the sandstone walls come alive with vibrant hues as the midday sun illuminates the chasm. Afterwards, you can purchase lunch at the Standley Chasm Café (own expense). Discover the innovative School of the Air, which brings education to primary school children living remotely. During the school term, you may be able to listen to and observe live lessons being broadcast on air. Conclude at the historic Telegraph Station. Learn about the early pioneers and the critical role this outpost played in connecting Australia to the rest of the world.


