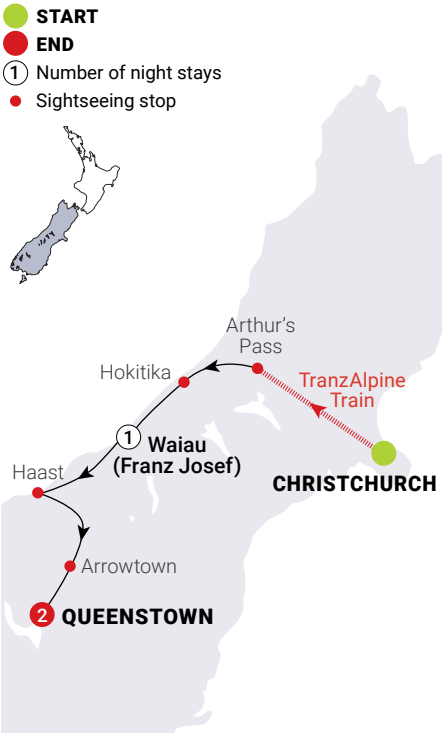
1 Christchurch - Waiau (Franz Josef)
